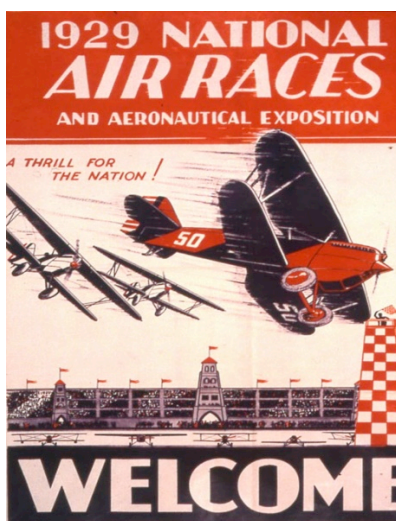

Cleveland Municipal Airport hosted the National Air Races, the fastest motor sport in the world, drawing international attention on Labor Day weekends during the 1930s and 40s. The National Air Races were a proving ground for aviation technology that played an important part in the development of WW II aircraft.
